

What to expect

Milestones Requirements

- Attendance at 100% of StartSmart New Student Orientation - Days 1 and 2 is mandatory.
- It is necessary to complete all StartSmart for Milestones modules in iLearn and submit the assignment.
- Attendance for all lectures is mandatory.
- You are required to participate and engage in iLearn multiple times each week utilising the module resources provided for your modules.

Responsibilities

- You are responsible for following your semester schedule.
- You have the freedom and responsibility to manage your time.
- You decide how to participate in co-curricular activities.
- You are expected to take responsibility for what you do or don't do.
- You are responsible for attending classes without being told.

Improvement

- Sources of information must be cited using professional style referencing guidelines such as AU Harvard, APA, OSCOLA.
- Finishing a project at the last minute is not an effective practice at university. You need time to check it over before submitting it.
- Mastery is often seen as the ability to apply what you learn to new situations or to solve problems.
- You need to study at least 2–3 hours each week for each class.
- Most learning takes place outside of class through reading, assignments, working with a group or meeting with the lecturer.

Grades

- You must learn strategies to overcome challenges in learning. Academic support is available but you must ask.
- A passing mark for assignments, modules or courses is 40 points out of 100.
- One module is usually worth 20 credits. However in level six your final year capstone project/dissertation is 40 credits. You can only progress to the next level if you earn 120 credits.
- You must inform your lecturers about absences. In case of serious illness or an extended absence, you must inform the University and may consider withdrawing officially.

Assignments

- Assignments may cover more material than covered in class. All aspects of a module, including lectures and readings may be on the assessment.
- Instructors expect reports, papers and essays to be well structured and to include analysis backed by evidence.
- You can ask questions about assignments.

Classes

- Lecturers often teach using PowerPoint slides on the screen.
- Group projects are common and assist you in learning the skills for applied learning, as well as for developing critical skills involved in working in teams.
- Attendance is required and very important to your success.



Plan ahead to ensure you are ready to submit your assignments for your modules in line with the published module deadlines (find these on iLearn).

The **number 15 bus** provides a direct route into Trafalgar Square, providing you with easy access to central London.




Birmingham Weather




Leeds Weather

The warm season lasts from June to September, with an average daily high temperature above 17°C. The hottest month of the year in Leeds is July, with an average high of 20°C and low of 12°C.

The cool season lasts from November to March, with an average daily high temperature below 9°C. The coldest month of the year in Leeds is January, with an average low of 2°C and high of 6°C.


